

Discussion and possible action regarding an Ordinance of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, Amending Part 10, Offenses and Crimes, Section 10-502 by Repealing and Replacing Same; Prohibiting Possession of Marijuana and Other Dangerous Substances; Providing for an Effective Date; Repealing All Ordinances or Parts of Ordinances in Conflict with this Ordinance; and Providing That If Any Part or Parts of this Ordinance Are Held Invalid or Ineffective, the Remaining Portions Shall Not Be Affected; Providing an Effective Date and Declaring an Emergency.

BACKGROUND:

With recent changes to state law regarding medical marijuana (effective in November 2019), changes to the City Code regarding unlawful use and possession of the same substance are required. Put simply, these changes provided by the proposed Ordinance will make the City Code compliant with state law regarding the possession and/or use of medical marijuana and allow for the City to continue to enforce the pertinent criminal regulations as part of its City Code.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the ordinance be adopted and authority for the Mayor to execute the same.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. The Sapulpa City Code, Part 10, Offenses and Crimes, Section 10-502, Marijuana and Dangerous Substances, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 10-502. - MARIJUANA AND DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES PROHIBITED.

A. - Definitions.

- Marijuana means all parts of the plant Cannabis sativa L., whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of such plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such plant, its seeds or resin; but shall not include the mature stalks of such plant, fiber produced from such stalks, oil, or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt derivative, mixture, or preparation of such mature stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil, or cake or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination.
- 2 Dangerous substance means any drug or substance included in Schedules I through V of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act found in 63 O.S.1991, §§ 2-101, et seq., including, but not limited to:
 - a. Cocaine and its derivatives;
 - b. Opiates and opium derivatives such as heroin, codeine, pethidine, and morphine;

- c. Hallucinogenic substances including lysergic acid diethylamide, marijuana (Cannabis sativa L.), including seed of mature plants, mescaline, psilocybin, and various types of methoxyamphetamines;
- d. Stimulants such as amphetamines and methamphetamines; and
- e. Barbiturates and other depressants such as amobarbital, secobarbital, pentobarbital, phenobarbital, methaqualone, phencyclidine, alprazolam, and diazepam.
- B. It is unlawful for any person to use, have, or possess any marijuana in any place in the City except as otherwise permitted by the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Act, 63 O.S. § 420, et. seq., as amended. It is unlawful for any person to use, have, or possess any dangerous substance (other than marijuana) in any place within the city except as legally prescribed by a physician licensed to practice in the state.
- C. It is unlawful for any person to appear or be upon or in any street, alley, place of business, or other public place within the city while under the influence of marijuana and/or any dangerous substance.
- D. Penalty. Unless otherwise expressly provided for in this Code or applicable state law, every person violating any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offense and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00); provided further that a subsequent offence may be punished by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment in the city jail for a period not to exceed ten (10) days, excluding costs, fees and assessments, or by both such fine and imprisonment; provided further, that possession of up to one and one-half (1.5) ounces of marijuana by persons who can state a medical condition, but are not in possession of a state-issued medical marijuana license, shall constitute a misdemeanor offense with a fine not to exceed Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00)."

Section 2. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of conflict only.

Section 3. If any part or parts of this ordinance are held invalid or ineffective, the remaining portion shall not be affected but remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 2.</u> All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of conflict only.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after November 1, 2019.

<u>Section 5</u>. EMERGENCY. Being immediately necessary that the provisions of this ordinance be put into full force and effect for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

The Contractors may be required to furnish the owner with a progress schedule in a format approved by the Owner, setting forth in detail the procedure he proposes to follow, and giving the date on which he expects to start and to complete separate portions of the work. If at any time, in the opinion of the Owner, proper progress is not being maintained, such changes shall be made in the schedule of operations which will satisfy the Owner that the work will be completed within the period stated in the proposal.
- C. If the Contractor shall fail to complete the work within the specified time, then the contractor agrees to pay to the Owner, not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages for such breach of Contract, the sum of \$100.00 for each day of failure to complete the work after the specified impracticability and extreme difficulty of fixing and ascertaining the actual damage the Owner would in such event sustain.

- D. It is further agreed that time is of the essence of each and every portion of this Contract and the specifications wherein a definite and certain time is fixed for the performance of any act whatsoever; and where under the contract an allowance of extra time for the completion of any work is made, the new time fixed by such extension shall be of the essence of this Contract.
- E. Should the Contractor be delayed in the final completion of the work by any act or neglect of the Owner, or of any employees of either, or by strikes, injunctions, fire, or other cause or causes outside of and beyond the control of the Contractor and which, in the opinion of the Owner, could have been neither anticipated nor avoided, then an extension of time sufficient to compensate for the delay, as determined by the Owner, shall be granted by the Owner, provided, however, that the Contractor shall give the Owner notice in writing of the cause of the delay in each case within ten (10) days after the delay.
- F. Extensions of time will not be granted based on inadequate construction force, or the failure of the Contractor to place orders for equipment or materials a sufficient time in advance to insure delivery when needed. Extensions of time will be provided if, in the opinion of the Owner, weather conditions have prevented performance within the time as herein specified. Any extension of time by the Owner shall not release the Contractor and surety herein from payment of liquidated damages for a period of time not included in the original Contract or the time extension as herein provided.
- G. Failure to complete the project within the specified time, as set forth in this Contract may be grounds for disqualification for future contracts with the City of Sapulpa.
- 10. BONDS: In the event the Bid amount is over \$25,000.00, the Contractor shall provide the City of Sapulpa with a Bid Bond or certified check as part of the sealed bid, such bond or check shall be 5% of the bid. In addition, Statutory, Performance and Maintenance Bonds shall be furnished to the City of Sapulpa, in the amount awarded, prior to execution of the Agreement.
